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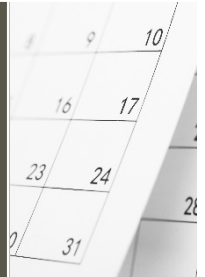

Tips for Winterizing Your Home

Winter is coming! Here are some tips for winterizing your home.

Exterior Hoses

Empty out all hoses and disconnect hoses and splitters. If possible, place

covers over hose bibs to insulate the faucets outside.

Kitchens / Bathrooms

Open cabinets to let warm air circulate around sink pipes that are prone to freezing,



and let faucets drip overnight. Find and label your water shut off valve in case a pipe breaks. This valve is usually in the basement near the utility stack. Turn off the water when away for long periods of time.

Bedrooms

Reverse your ceiling fans in a clockwise direction to push warm air downwards and help to circulate air accordingly. In some instances, reversing ceiling fans can cut heating costs.



Fireplaces

Check the flue damper to make sure it's operating properly and that it opens and closes with ease. Open the flue before you light a fire. Clean fireplace regularly and don't hang holiday decorations near the open flame. Keep a fire extinguisher nearby. Arrange for someone to be home during the annual chimney cleaning and inspection days.

Pumpkin Spice and Everything Nice

Try this: Follow the recipe on Libby's 100% Pure Pumpkin but double the spices for extra flavor! This spicy pumpkin pie has been a longtime tradition in my family.

What's Next at The Springs Condos

Chimney Cleaning and Inspections: Stove Depot will perform annual chimney cleaning and inspections over the course of two days in January, at \$125.00/unit.

Gutter Cleaning: After the remainder of the leaves fall, Dominguez Handyman Services will complete gutter cleaning of all buildings, estimated to take 6 hours for a total of \$282.00.

Snow Shoveling/Plowing: Ruano Landscaping will provide snow shoveling and plowing this winter, at \$50.00/hour for shoveling and \$100.00 for plowing both parking lots.

2023 Budget: The HOA's budget for the next fiscal year will be mailed to Owners ahead of the Annual Owners' Meeting, which will take place in January 2023.
